### **RAMS General**

All activities provided by MVEC are carefully prepared, however, should you feel uncertain about the safety of any activity, and we encourage you to immediately discuss this with us.

PLEASE NOTE: A CLASS LIST, with school contact details in case of an emergency are to be forwarded or supplied on the day of the visit ADULTS ACCOMPANIED BY PRE-SCHOOL STUDENTS CANNOT BE COUNTED AS ADDITIONAL HELPERS

- Please inform staff of any students in wheelchairs, on crutches or whom have medical or behavioural conditions prior to or on arrival at Shantytown.
- Any students with asthma should carry their own inhaler at all times. Students who suffer from severe reactions should have an adult in the group with their medication eg Epi-pen.
- If a student becomes unwell the visiting teacher will instigate procedures as required by the visiting school's policy, in conjunction with MVEC staff.
- Full first aid kits are situated at the MVEC Office and at the Main Office, as well as at the train station, in train carriage and at the gold claim.
- All injuries must be reported to a MVEC staff member immediately.
- In the case of injury, trained first aiders in consultation with the class teacher will assess the situation. If hospital treatment is considered advisable an ambulance will be called or transport to hospital organised.
- Many of MVEC's programmes are not suitable for pre-school children. Should a pre-school child accompany the visiting class the parent or guardian cannot be counted in the ratio and cannot be given responsibility of a specific group of students.
- Groups working independently in various locations on site will still require close supervision by accompanying adults.
- The overall behaviour of the class is the responsibility of the class teacher throughout the visit. A teacher or responsible adult from the visiting school must be with the group at all times even when the session is being led by MVEC or Shantytown staff.
- Safety and behaviour of the class are the visiting teacher's responsibility during morning tea and lunch breaks and on the completion of the day's programme. Boundaries and guidelines for these periods will be outlined to the class prior to 'hand over' to the class room teacher. Victorian playground equipment and games are available for the children to use under supervision.
- This hazard register is a live document, with hazard identification and risk management ongoing. This register is constantly being updated as required and reviewed by MVEC staff after any incident, accident or near miss, and at yearly monitoring reviews.
